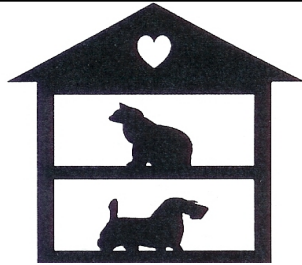

It is understood that the Humane Society for Boone County (HSforBC) does not own the fostered animal. HSforBC is only an agent representing the welfare of the fostered animal until it is adopted.

As a fostering family you must provide to HSforBC the contact information of any adoption candidate that may remove an animal from your home.

A fostered animal may or may not be spayed or neutered. It also may not be current on required vaccinations.

It is also understood that a friendly, fostered animal once in your home may show aggressive or unpredictable behavior. It is your responsibility to monitor the fostered animal for the safety of your family as well as the animal's welfare.

If for any reason you decide that the fostered animal can not continue living at your home you must give notice and allow HSforBC time to arrange placement to a new foster home or pick up.
