Fur Ball festivities start now with silent auction online By Wendy Gabers

The Humane Society for Boone County's 11th annual Fur Ball—the "pawpular" Mardi Gras themed fundraiser that helps HSforBC rescue and care for homeless dogs and cats—is February 24 at the Golf Club of Indiana.

There are just two pairs of tickets available so reserve them now while they last! But even if you can't attend, you can still participate and help the animals by bidding in both the silent and live auctions.

The "pawsome" online silent auction features a variety of unique items and packages with something for everyone! There are tickets to musical, cultural, sports and museum events, handmade quilts and driver autographed limited edition motorsport art prints. You can also bid on professional and collegiate sports tickets, home décor, personal pampering packages, original autographed artwork, pet pampering and enrichment packages filled with toys, blankets, beds and treats, and other "furbulous" items.

The online auction opened at noon on February 18 and closes at noon on February 25. Auction bidding can be accessed online at <u>HSforBCFurBall.givesmart.com</u>. Check back often to see new items added and the status of your bids.

Event attendees will have the opportunity to bid on items onsite with a live auction in the Cardinal Room that includes a Key West getaway and the annual favorite "Eat Your Way Around Boone County" basket filled with gift cards from restaurants, wine, spirits and more! All live items will be bid on and sold during the event. Proxy bidding for the live auction can be arranged if you can't attend by contacting us in advance with your maximum bid amount.

Doors open at 5:45 p.m., a Cajun dinner will be served at 6 p.m., and the program starts at 7 p.m.

"We are so grateful to the event sponsors and auction item donors," said Susan Austin, interim executive director. "They help make this event happen, and it all raises funds that allow us to provide care for more dogs, cats, puppies and kittens in need."

The silent auction item pickup and wine/spirits pickup are at the shelter at 5366 S. Indianapolis Road in Whitestown from 2 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. on February 25.

Mummy and her kittens learn about love in foster homes By Mary Ann Garber

October 18 was "Caughtcha Day" for a hungry and homeless scaredy cat and her three kittens.

HSforBC Cat Program volunteer Claire Haughton rescued the young mama kitty and her babies using humane traps on that late October day then chose Halloween theme names for the feline family. She named the frightened brown Tabby cat Mummy, her male brown Tabby kitten Trick, her male fluffy black kitten Treat and her female black kitten Boo.

Fosters Anne and Denis Oberg cared for the kittens to prepare them for adoption. After the kittens received vaccinations and spay or neuter surgery, Trick was the first sibling to find his forever family on November 9. Boo was adopted after meeting her people on December 2 during HSforBC's annual Whiskerfest holiday fundraiser and adoption event. Then Treat celebrated the New Year a little late with his adoption on January 14.

Pretty Mummy is a friendly but shy kitty who has needed more socialization time to prepare her for adoption so Jen, also a Cat Program volunteer, is fostering her and keeping a journal to document her progress.

By Week 4 of foster care, Mummy was calmer and less skittish.

"She continues to come out of her shell more and more," Jen said. "She is obviously still very much a kitten. She plays well with her toys by herself. This week I worked on picking her up and holding her while I'm standing. By the end of the week, I have been able to hold her close to my chest for over a minute. Now when she is finished being held and begins to wiggle, she allows me to lower her to the ground where she eagerly accepts her treats."

Mummy enjoys sleeping on a sofa and chairs, she said, and now also snuggles on her lap.

"She is really becoming a cuddle bug," Jen said. "She slept at the end of my bed a couple of times."

A week later, Mummy was "much more relaxed" even around visitors, Jen said. "She watches from a distance then warms up quickly. She is a full-on lap cat. She has a strong, loud and healthy purr. She's a talker, especially when it's chow time. She asks for me to sit so she can crawl up on my lap. She loves chasing her toys. In the beginning, she preferred to play alone but now she's very interactive with me and her toys. She is a sweet cat."

During January and February, Mummy has kept busy playing with toys, looking out the windows, zooming around the house, helping Jen with computer work and napping in sunny spots.

After four months of patient and loving foster care, Mummy has transitioned from a scaredy cat on Halloween to an affectionate companion on Valentine's Day. Mummy has been spayed and is up to date on her vaccinations, and now she is ready for her forever home too.



One of our volunteers will be in contact with you to find out how many and what kind of pets you need help feeding. We can arrange for pet food pickup at the shelter.

HSforBC also provides a monthly Pet Pantry across the street from Volunteer Fire Station #51 at 102 E. Wall Street in Advance on the third Tuesday of every month from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m.

We also partner with St. Joseph Church in Lebanon during their monthly food pantry. The pantry is held from 9:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. on the first Saturday of each month at the church parking lot. St. Joseph Church is located at 319 E. South Street in Lebanon.
